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The table above represents the details of IP and district wise formation of Village Reconstruction Committees (VRCs) in the month of June 2023 and the cumulative VRCs formed since the inception of the project, with the number of male and female members. In June 2023 the total VRCs formed were 1,349 having total member ship of 9,146 out of which 5,743 were male and 3,403 were female. With respect to the cumulative formation of VRCs, the total VRCs formed were 27,641 having total membership of 175,409 (101,420 male members and 73,989 female members).

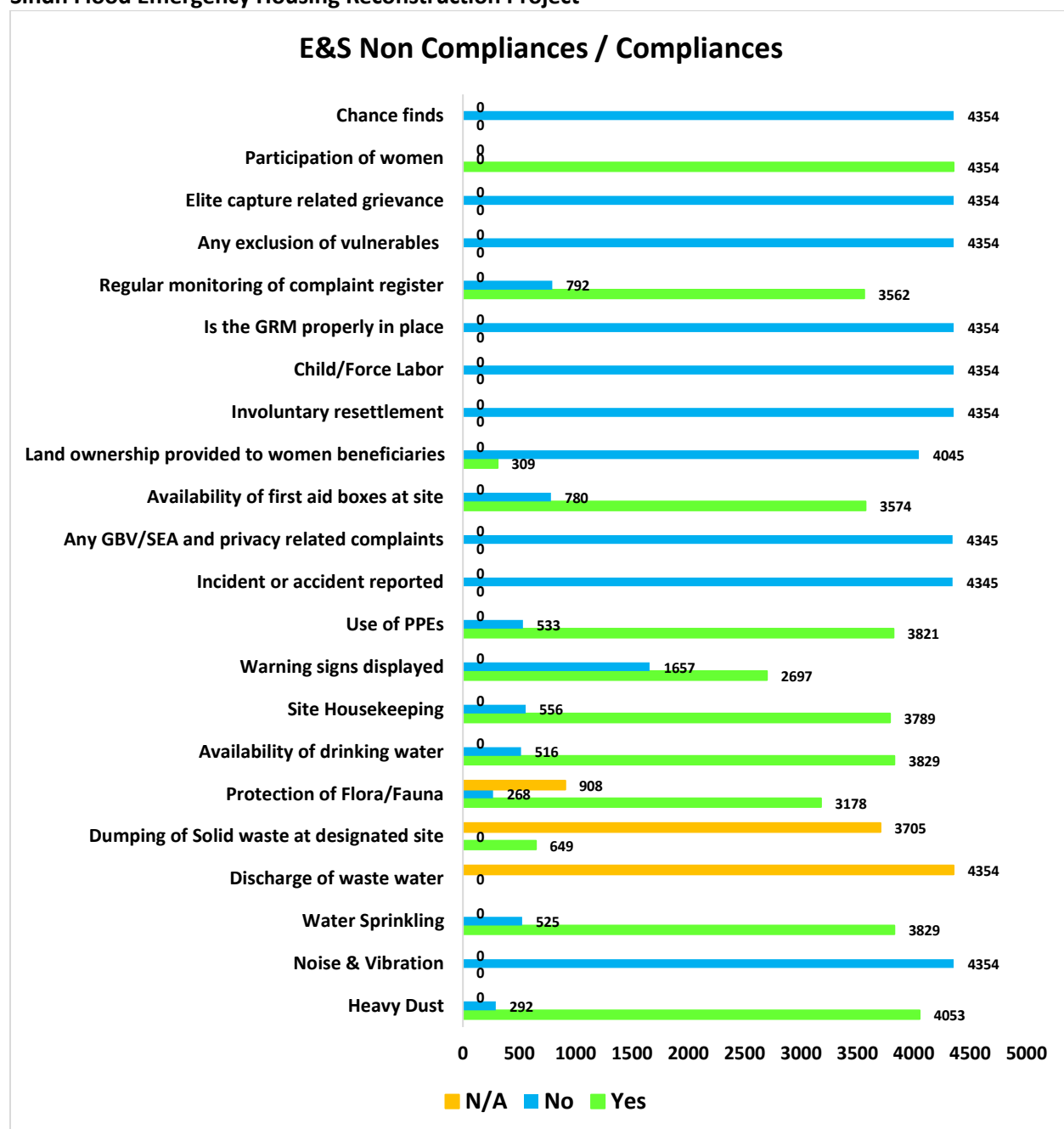

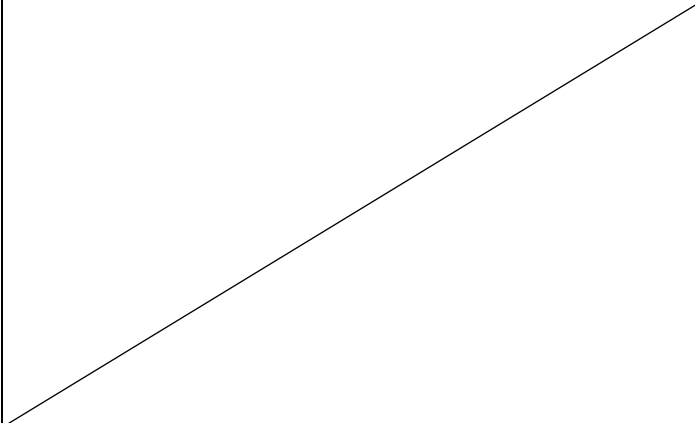
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Corrective Actions Taken

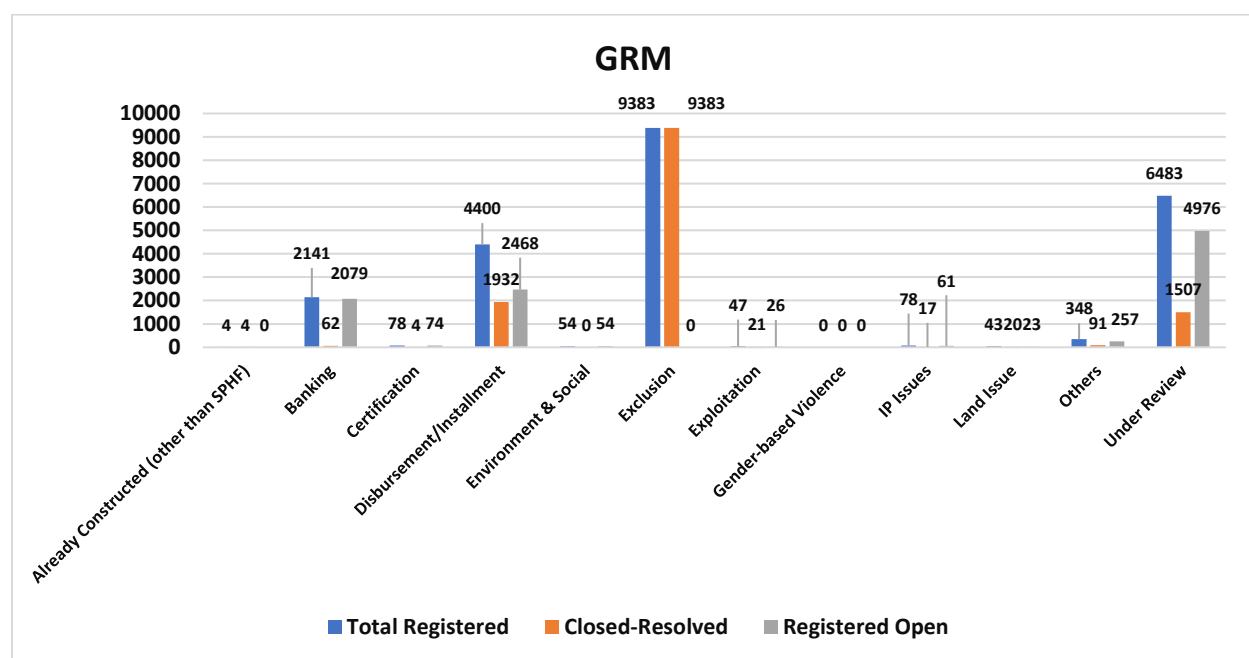

The and the table above shoes different categories of the complains registered in GRM system (23,059), number of complains resolved (13,040) and open (10,017). The highest number of complains reported are for exclusion cases i.e., 9,383 which have been resolved, 2nd highest number of complains are related to under process category (6,483) out of which 1,507 have been resolved and 4,976 are still open. Other categories which have significant number of complains are related to disbursement and banking which are 4,400 and 2,141.
