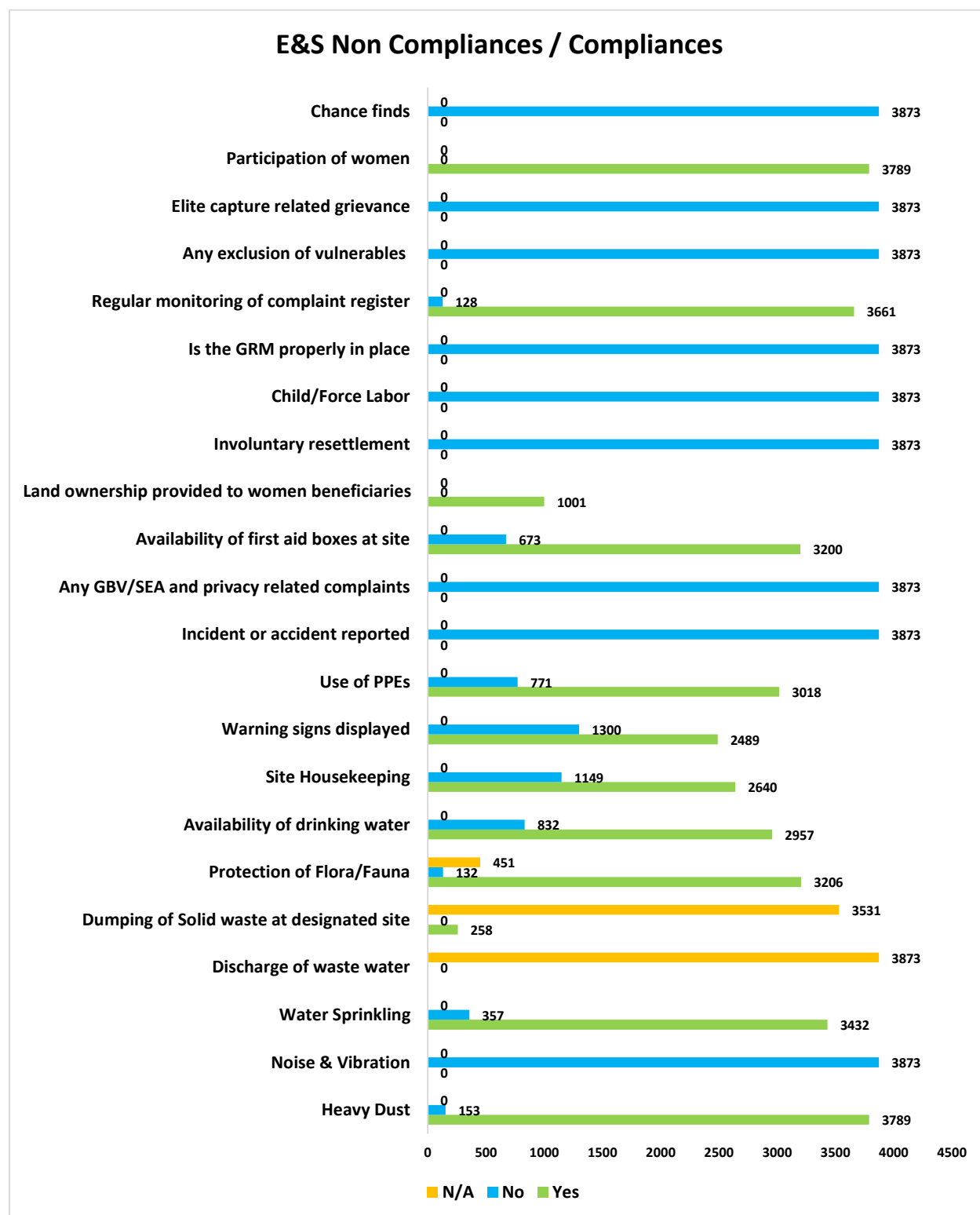

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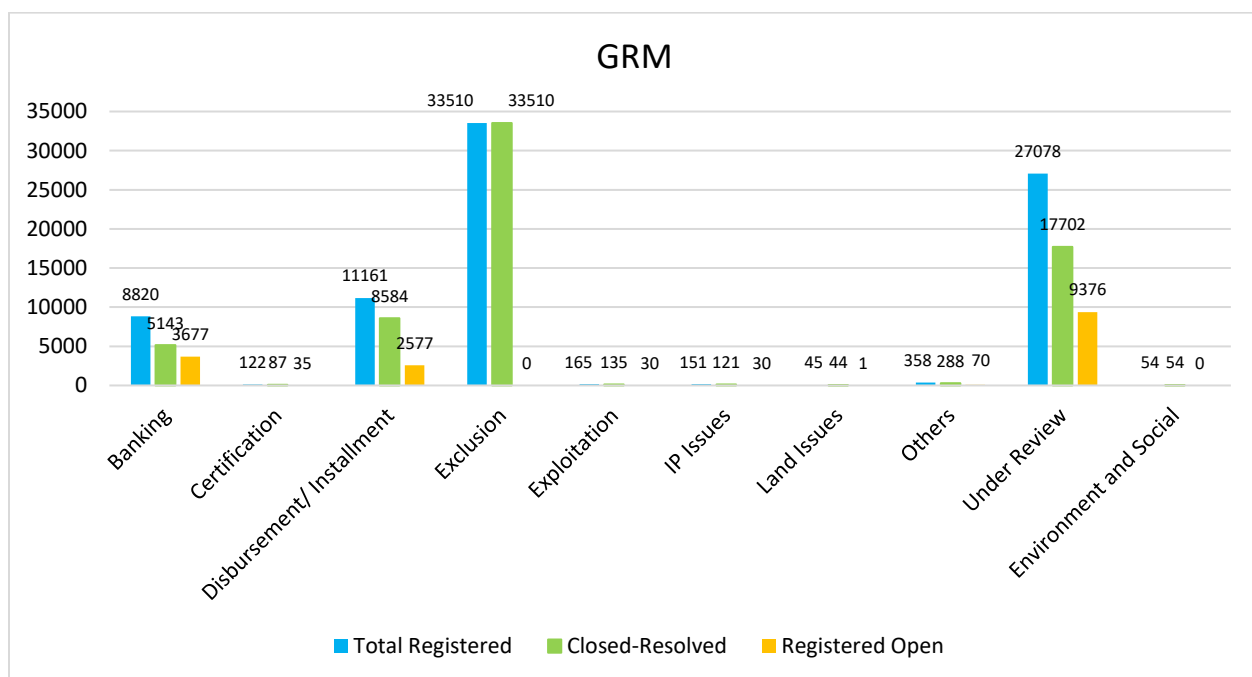

Corrective Actions Taken

S. No.	Parameters	Corrective Measures
1	Heavy Dust	Material was covered/stored on the location away from the windy areas to avoid dust emissions.

3	Water Sprinkling	It was advised to sprinkle water regularly on construction site during construction activities to avoid dust emissions.

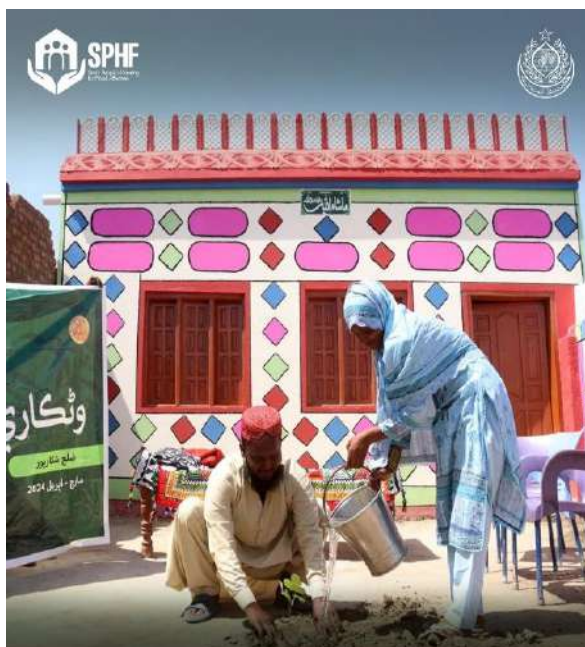
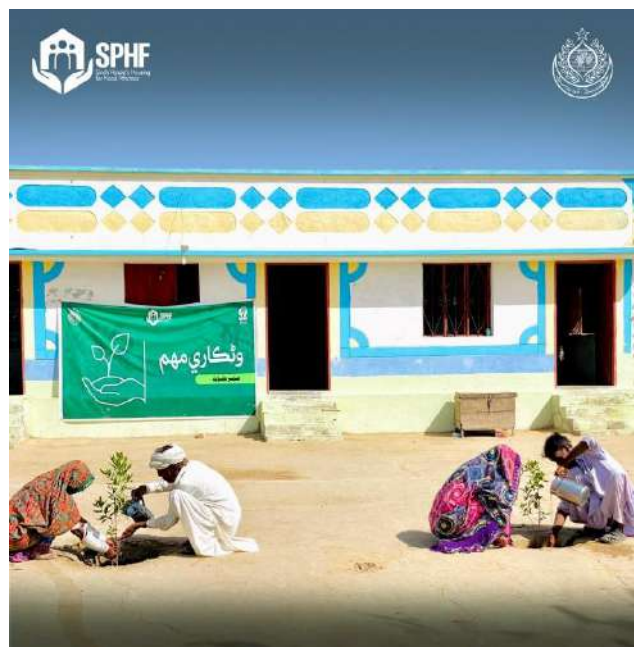
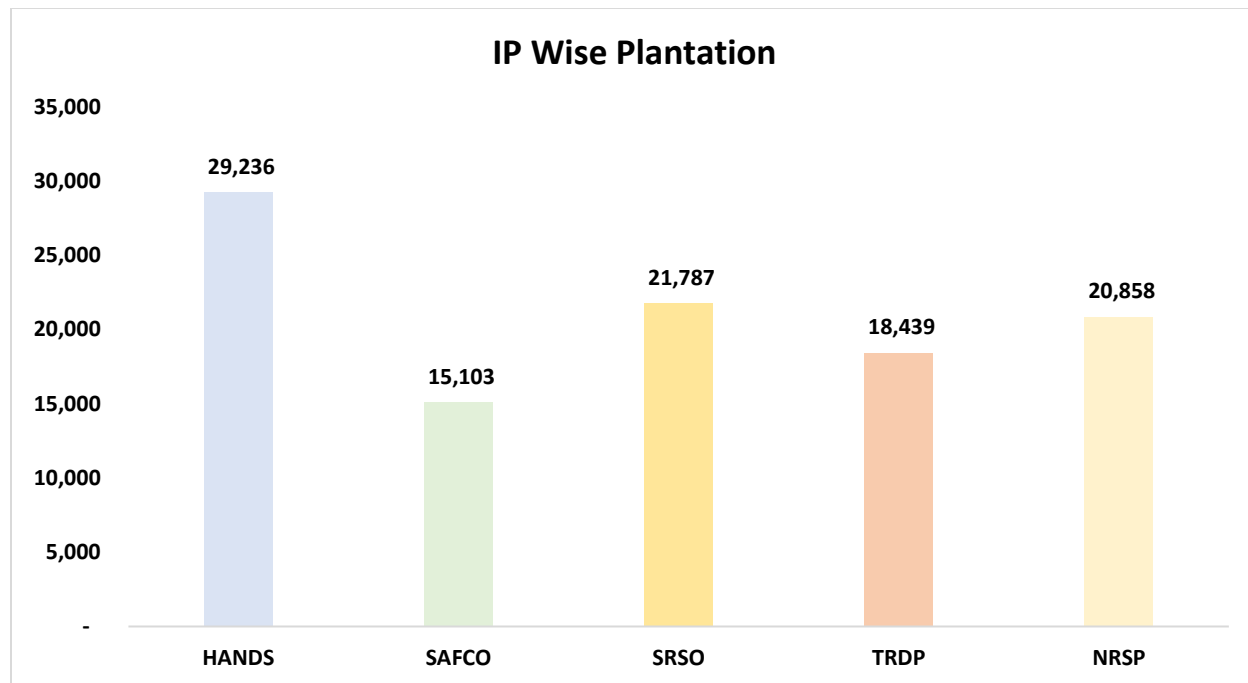

Plantation

SPHF started tree plantation drive with the provision of planting 110,000 trees in 24 project districts of Sindh. As of December 2024, 105,423 saplings were planted. Below are the details of saplings planted by the Implementing Partners.



MIRZO AWAN – CLIMATECHANGETOWN.PK

Mirzo Awan village, a site proposed for the pilot interventions is located Tando Muhammad Khan Taluka in Tando Muhammad Khan District, is first ever initiative in Pakistan with a goal to establish climate resilience investment portfolio at village/settlement level. The name of the village has been changed to “Climate Change Town” with a goal to develop a model climate-resilient settlement plan.

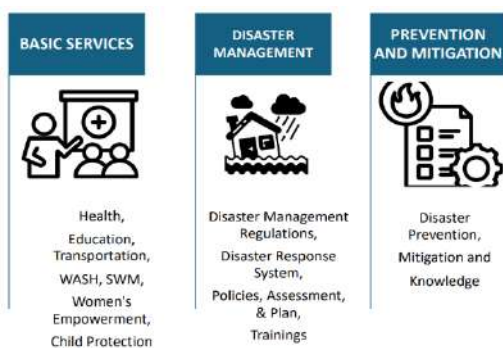
